PUBLIC HEARING TO ADOPT LOCAL LAW 2-2022 TO AMEND THE CODE OF THE VILLAGE OF ATLANTIC BEACH CHAPTER 159 – PEACE AND GOOD ORDER

A Local Law to Amend the Code of the Incorporated Village of Atlantic Beach Chapter 159 entitled "Peace and Good Order"

Be it enacted by the Board of Trustees of the Incorporated Village of Atlantic Beach as follows:

Section 2. Chapter 159 entitled "Peace and Good Order" regulating prohibited acts, Section 159-2-F is hereby replaced with the following language:

159-2-F

"Operate any power or manual equipment or perform any construction earlier than 8:00am on weekdays and earlier than 9:00am on Saturday or later than 6:00pm on any day; or operate any power or manual equipment or perform any construction on weekends from June 1 through the second weekend in September, including Memorial Day, July 4th, Labor Day and all legal holidays throughout the year <u>except for Martin Luther King, Jr. Day, Columbus Day, Presidents' Day, Election Day, Veterans Day and the day after Thanksgiving.</u>

Section 2. Full Force & Effect.

Except as hereinabove amended, Chapter 159 shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 3. Repealer.

All ordinances, local laws or resolutions, or parts of ordinances, local laws or resolutions of the Incorporated Village of Atlantic Beach inconsistent with the provisions of this local law are hereby repealed, provided, however, that such repeal shall be only to the extent of such inconsistency and in all other respects this local law shall be in addition to other legislation regulating and governing the subject matter covered by this local law.

Section 4. Severability.

If any section, paragraph, subdivision or provision of this local law shall be adjudged invalid or held unconstitutional, the same shall not affect the validity of this local law as a whole or any part or provision thereof, other than the part so decided to be invalid or unconstitutional.

Section 5. Effective Date.

This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of the State of New York.

BOND RESOLUTION - \$1,000,000 PURCHASE OF REAL PROPERTY, 2035 PARK STREET

BOND RESOLUTION DATED NOVEMBER 14, 2022.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE PURCHASE AND IMPROVEMENT OF REAL PROPERTY LOCATED AT 2035 PARK STREET FOR VILLAGE PURPOSES, IN AND FOR THE VILLAGE OF ATLANTIC BEACH, NASSAU COUNTY, NEW YORK, AT A TOTAL MAXIMUM ESTIMATED COST OF \$1,000,000, AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$1,000,000 BONDS OF SAID VILLAGE TO PAY THE COSTS THEREOF.

BE IT RESOLVED by the affirmative vote of not less than two-thirds of the total voting strength of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Atlantic Beach, Nassau County, New York, as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> The purchase and improvement of real property located at 2035 Park Street for Village purposes in and for the Village of Atlantic Beach, Nassau County, New York, including incidental expenses in connection therewith is hereby authorized at a total maximum estimated cost of \$1,000,000 and the plan of financing thereof is by the issuance of \$1,000,000 bonds of said Village hereby authorized to be issued therefor pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

<u>Section 2.</u> The period of probable usefulness of such class of objects or purposes is thirty years pursuant to subdivision 30 of paragraph a of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law. It is hereby further determined that the maximum maturity of the bonds authorized will not exceed five years.

<u>Section 3.</u> Subject to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance and sale of the bonds herein authorized, including renewals of such notes, is hereby delegated to the Village Treasurer, the chief fiscal officer. Such notes shall be of such terms, form and contents, and shall be sold in such manner, as may be prescribed by said Village Treasurer, consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 4. The powers and duties of advertising such bonds for sale, conducting the sale and awarding the bonds, are hereby delegated to the Village Treasurer, who shall advertise such bonds for sale, conduct the sale, and award the bonds in such manner as she shall deem best for the interests of said Village, provided, however, that in the exercise of these delegated powers, she shall comply fully with the provisions of the Local Finance Law and any order or rule of the State Comptroller applicable to the sale of municipal bonds. The receipt of the Village Treasurer shall be a full acquittance to the purchaser of such bonds, who shall not be obliged to see to the application of the purchase money.

<u>Section 5.</u> All other matters except as provided herein relating to the bonds herein authorized including the date, denominations, maturities and interest payment dates,

Page Four Minutes 11-14-2022 within the limitations prescribed herein and the manner of execution of the same, including the consolidation with other issues, and also the ability to issue bonds with substantially level or declining annual debt service, shall be determined by the Village Treasurer, the chief fiscal officer of such Village. Such bonds shall contain substantially the recital of validity clause provided for in Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law, and shall otherwise be in such form and contain such recitals, in addition to those required by Section 51.00 of the Local Finance Law, as the Village Treasurer shall determine consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

<u>Section 6.</u> The faith and credit of said Village of Atlantic Beach, Nassau County, New York, are hereby irrevocably pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds as the same become due and payable. An annual appropriation shall be made in each year sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds becoming due and payable in such year. There shall annually be levied on all the taxable real property of said Village, a tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds as the same become due and payable

<u>Section 7.</u> The validity of such bonds and bond anticipation notes may be contested only if:

- 1) Such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which said Village is not authorized to expend money, or
- 2) The provisions of law which should be complied with as the date of publication of this resolution are not substantially complied with,

and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or

3) Such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution. Section 8. This resolution shall constitute a statement of official intent for purposes of Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2. Other than as specified in this resolution, no monies are, or are reasonably expected to be, reserved, allocated on a long-term basis, or otherwise set aside with respect to the permanent funding of the object or purpose described herein.

<u>Section 9.</u> This resolution, which takes effect immediately, shall be published in summary form in the official newspaper of said Village hereby designated for such purpose, together with a notice of the Village Clerk in substantially the form set forth in paragraph a of Section 81.00 of the Local Finance Law.
